Brown bin

for organic waste

Rule of thumb: Only put organic waste in the organic waste bin that can also go on a compost heap.

Kitchen waste

- Bread, baked goods leftovers
- Eggshells
- Fish remains and bones *
- Meat and sausage leftovers *
- Vegetable and salad waste
- Coffee filter papers
- Coffee grounds
- Bones *
- Spoiled foodstuffs * (without packaging)
- Nutshells
- Fruit waste (including peel of tropical fruits)
- Leftovers, raw, cooked, spoiled *
- Tea bags, tea leaves
- * only small standard household amounts

Garden rubbish

- Bedding material
- Tree cuttings, bark and branches
- Flowers, cut flowers, potting soil
- Windfall
- Hedge clippings, twigs
- Hay, straw (small amounts)
- Leaves, needles, moss
- Plants, plant parts, potted flowers (without pot)
- Lawn and grass cuttings
- Shrub clippings, branches
- Weeds, wild herbs

Other organic waste

- Paper organic waste bags
- Kitchen paper (paper towels)
- Feathers, hair
- Wood shavings, wood chips, sawdust (only from untreated wood)
- Paper towels, handkerchiefs, napkins

Always wrap moist organic waste in paper. Advantages: no maggots, less odour, waste doesn't freeze and stick to the bin.

Blue bin

for waste paper

Rule of thumb: Only put paper and *cardboard* in the blue bin.

Paper / cardboard

- Books
- Calendars
- Boxes
- Catalogues
 - Paper packaging
 - Magazines
 - Newspapers

Photos, milk and juice cartons, soiled paper, wallpaper or thermal fax paper do *not* belong in the blue bin.

Yellow bin

for lightweight packaging

Rule of thumb: The yellow bin is only intended for *empty packaging* made of metal, plastics and composite materials with a licensed symbol; this includes e.g. the Green Dot (Grüner Punkt).

- Pharmaceutical blister packs (no medicines)
- Buttermilk cups
- Butter packaging
- Ice cream packaging
- Paint buckets (emptied)
- Beverage cartons (composite materials)
- Wooden boxes (packaging)
- Yogurt pots and lids
- Tins/cans
- Margarine tubs
- Trays of ready-made meals
- Plastic milk bags
- Plastic cereal bar wrappers
- Pasta bags
- Fruit and vegetable trays (plastic foam)
- Chocolate foil
- Shampoo bottles
- Spray cans (emptied)
- Washing-up liquid bottles
- Cooking oil bottles (plastic)
- Stoneware bottles
- Polystyrene/styrofoam packaging
- Soup bags
- Pet food tins/cans
- Toothpaste tubes
- etc.

Paper packaging belongs in the blue bin, packaging glass in the bottle bank.

Grey bin

for residual waste

Rule of thumb: The residual waste bin is intended for any domestic waste that *doesn't* belong in the *yellow* or *brown* bin and isn't building rubble, hazardous waste or electronic scrap.

- Ash
- Wire
- Light bulbs, halogen lamps
- Photos, slides and negatives
- Waste rubber
- Hygiene products
- Cassettes (music, video)
- Sweepings
- Ceramics, porcelain
- Candle remains
- Ballpoint pen refills
- Small animal litter. cat litter
- Leather odds and ends
- Cloths, cleaning towels (without oil)

Problem waste must not be disposed

of in the residual waste bin but must

be handed in to the hazardous waste

collection vehicle or to the Rhein-

Lahn waste management centre.

- Toys (without electronics)
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Wallpaper
